They will need to be flexible with their schedule and able to manage change at short notice with a calmness under pressure. Above all else they will ensure that in all aspects of their work, the needs of the children are the main consideration.

- Liaise with Class Teachers, Heads of Department, Heads of Year, and the AGT Co-ordinator to ensure a cohesive approach to learning
- > Liaise and coordinate with outside specialists to deliver therapy sessions during school hours
- Be highly effective in communicating with parents and other professionals through excellent written and verbal skills
- Coordinate timetables for Teaching and Learning Assistants and ensure all staff are deployed appropriately to meet pupils' need
- Prepare and deliver CPD on issues related to SEN and EAL to all staff for personal, professional and school development.
