- Have a minimum of 3 years of experience teaching EAL to Year 7 to Year 13 pupils
- Have knowledge of EAL assessments and programmes, for example TEFL / CELTA
- Experience in a SEN role is beneficial
- To have up to date knowledge and understanding of the British Curriculum
- To maintain a professional relationship with both colleagues and parents and to promote the School's best interests both in and out of working hours
- Liaise with Director of Inclusion and assist with administrative duties
- Have experience of conducting and interpreting standardised assessments related to EAL
- Have an awareness and experience of providing effective support to pupils with EAL
- Identify pupil needs and establish Individualised Learning Programmes
- Contribute and collate information for Annual Reviews
- To actively promote the social, moral and cultural ethos of the College community
- Have a clear awareness of strategies for raising achievement of pupils with EAL



- Plan and deliver intervention programmes to individuals and small groups to support learning
- Track pupil progress and evaluate effectiveness of intervention
- Use current pupil data to identify areas of weakness and provide appropriate support
- Monitor pupils' social, emotional and behavioural development
- Liaise with Class Teachers, Heads of Department, Heads of Year, and the AGT Co-ordinator to ensure a cohesive approach to learning
- Liaise and coordinate with outside specialists to deliver therapy sessions during school hours
- Be highly effective in communicating with parents and other professionals through excellent written and verbal skills
- Coordinate timetables for Teaching and Learning Assistants and ensure all staff are deployed appropriately to meet pupils' need
- Prepare and deliver CPD on issues related to EAL to all staff for personal, professional and school development.
- Implement departmental and school policies relating to health, safety, child protection and safeguarding
- Make contributions to the development of the department's policies and practices
- Be an excellent team player, prepared to work with enthusiasm, good humour and excellent interpersonal skills
